Advice to all cess pools and septic tanks owners

If you are connected to mains drains or have a completely self-contained cesspool then you do not need to read on. For everybody else the following is a summary of a legal requirement for you to take. Failure to do so could result in further action being taken by the Environment Agency.

If you are connected to mains drainage this won't concern you. If you are not on mains drainage you will have to decide what kind of a system you have - Is it a cesspool or a septic tank? A proper cesspool is a sealed tank with no outflow and it has to be emptied regularly (for example monthly). A septic tank is in effect a mini sewage works. It should have two compartments and method for the wastewater to drain away, usually into land drains in what is called a drainage or leaching field, or a soakaway, or a water course. In the Stelling Minnis area they may drain into a bore hole which has been sunk to the underlying chalk bed because the land does allow sufficient drainage. The official guidance is that these should be emptied (desludged) twice a year. In practice they can work well, and many people may not have had them emptied for years. There are also some which are in between and these are usually older brick cesspools (modern ones are usually fibre glass) which may have lost some bricks in the side - either accidentally with age or even on purpose (not done by yourself of course but some previous resident). In these cases, the waste is still foul water and drains away into the ground. In practice this is illegal as are septic tanks draining directly onto the land or bore hole without an intermediate filter chamber. Septic tanks draining via a filter bed to a deep bore hole must also meet certain other criteria relating to distance from water extraction sources and ground conditions which prevent the more acceptable land drain (leaching fields) systems from being used – percolation tests have to be carried out to prove that the ground is unsuitable for land drainage.

Septic tanks and other sewage systems which drain into water courses bore holes or the ground, or multi-user sewage systems are required to register with the Environment Agency. Septic tanks that discharge directly into the ground or a bore hole, i.e. not via filtration system, or systems which are not regularly emptied (de-sludged), will not be able to be registered and will require an environmental permit.

In some circumstances where a registration cannot be accepted then the owner may have to apply for an environmental permit for which could involve a site inspection. Examples of circumstances include if you have not had the tank emptied in the last six months or it is within a given distance of a drinking water extraction point.

There are other factors, which can affect the acceptance of registration such as the volume discharged and the number of residents. The rules also apply to business premises including farms.

This contains all the information, questions and answers and links to gather the information you need to register, including national grid map reference and a quick calculator for the volume of liquid discharged based on number of people in the premises (over or under 9 persons) and links to register you sewage system.

If you are not on the internet then there is a manual option available via a link from the same web site – you will need to get a friend to download and print the form for you, go to the library and use the internet there or obtain a form by post from the environment agency Tel: 03708 506 506 (Mon - Fri 8am - 6pm)

A copy of the registration and permit must be filed with the deeds of the property and you should keep receipts as proof of regular emptying (desludging) and maintenance for 5 years. Property sales could be held up for those properties where registration and a permit are required and they have not been obtained.

Hardres and Stelling News

The Hardres and Stelling News is the Village magazine for the Villages of Bossingham, Stelling Minnis and Upper Hardres; a sample copy is enclosed with this welcome pack. The magazine is published monthly with a low yearly subscription payable in January.
